


ON THE BEATEN PATH

Back in Paperback, with a new afterword by the authorĐ' Of the thru-hikers who set out to walk the entire Appalachian Trail, most donĐ²Đ,â,¢t make it. Robert RubinĐ²Đ,â,¢s chances didnĐ²Đ,â,¢t look good. Thirty-eight years old, dispirited, and burned out by a job he no longer loved, he decided to leave mortgage and wife and cul-de-sac life behind for a journey that could take half a yearĐ²Đ,―or perhaps never end. On the trailĐ²Đ,â,¢s wooded ridges, Rubin found himself part of a strange vagrant culture of pilgrims and dropouts, a world with its own rules and rituals. With eloquence and humor, he recounts his trekĐ²Đ,―the people he met, the landscapes he passed through, the spiritual and physical endurance involved (despite a diet heavy in Snickers bars and macaroni & cheese, he lost seventy-five pounds along the way). On the Beaten Path is a wise, witty look at one of the few remaining pilgrimages in our disillusioned age.
