



The Brontë's: Scenes from the Childhood of Charlotte, Branwell, Emily and Anne, Catherine Brighton, Frances Lincoln Limited, 2004, 1845073347, 9781845073343, 32 pages. Few literary families were as touched by genius or drama as the Brontë's. Set against the backdrop of the Yorkshire moors, Catherine Brighton's illustrated biography brings Charlotte, Branwell, Emily, and Anne to life. All children play at make-believe, but the Brontë's went a step further, creating and chronicling their own charmed universe in their remote parsonage at Haworth. Based on elder sister Charlotte's journals, The Brontë's recounts days spent in their isolated world, "dear Papa's" sermons, and the children's increasingly obsessive interest in creating imaginary worlds. Dreamy, detailed illustrations show the romance of the family's existence, while the authentic voice of Charlotte creates a moving portrait of a glittering, fanciful world every bit as enchanting as the ones these young artists created..
