Roger Priddy left school at 16 with just one qualification in art. He went to Berkshire College of Art and Design and trained as an illustrator. His first job in children's books was working with the publisher Peter Usborne, at Usborne Publishing, and then he worked with Peter Kindersley

at Dorling Kindersley, where he spent 16 years. Priddy became Creative Director of DK's Children's Division and was Managing Director of the children's mass market publisher Funfax when it was acquired by DK.

In 2000, he created Priddy Books with John Sargent at St Martin's Press to create innovative and imaginative titles for children, from first books for babies through early reference titles for older children. Since then, over 30 million copies of Roger's 200 plus books have sold worldwide, with five of his books; My Big Animal, My Big Truck, Happy Baby Words, Happy Baby Colors and Puppy and Friends; each selling over one million copies. He is also the author of Big Board First 100 Words; Big Board Books Colors, ABC, Numbers; and Bright Baby Noisy Monsters. His creativity has been recognized with numerous industry awards. Priddy lives in London with his wife Zena and their four children.

I made the mistake of quickly ordering by looking at the title. The Squishy Turtle included is a board book version of the pull-out style soft book, and the Fuzzy Bee book is cloth but does not have the pull-outs. The versions of the books that DO contain the pullouts, in my opinion are superior. This being said, the product is still a decent value so I will give it a low rating, its just somewhat deceiving.

This was given to me as a shower gift, for my baby boy. As someone with no expectations, I love this combo! Fuzzy bee is a soft book, with a crinkly cover. My son will hold it for a long time by himself, chewing on it, squeezing it and enjoying the noises, as well as the bright pages. He also likes when I read him squishy turtle because of the bright colors, and he likes to slap his hand on the hard pages. I would like to try the other versions of the books, now that I know about them.

My son's daughter loved her Fuzzy Bee cloth book, so I sent this pack to my younger grandbaby for Christmas. I was very, very disappointed to learn recently when I went to visit her that the Squishy Turtle is a board book, not a cloth book, and that the Fuzzy Bee cloth book does not have the touch and feel features or pull out wings that the regular Fuzzy Bee cloth book has. Beware if you order this pack that the cloth book lacks the special features and that the Squishy Turtle book isn't squishy at all because it is a board book. Even so, my 6 month old granddaughter likes the Fuzzy Bee book.

How I wish there were more cloth books like Fuzzy Bee and Friends! The bold black stripes that frame the pages make the book easy for your baby's eyes to see, and one fact about the little creature on each page gives your baby just enough information to absorb. On the first page, a small red bug creates a contrast against a large green leaf: not an ant, a snail, or slug./ It's a spotty, dotty ladybug! On the opposite page, your baby gets to see what a snail looks like: Keep moving snail, you're really slow./ You've got a long, long way to go. The text even makes a foray into early wordplay: Don't be fooled by a scary name,/ this dragonfly is really tame. The cloth pages make a gentle crackly sound, and the back cover recaps all six new friends.

Squishy Turtle and Friends, also included in this transparent portable pack, makes a sturdy board book. Bold stripes also outline these pages, which highlight underwater creatures. My favorite spread stars a trio of fish swimming off to your baby's left (Little fish with shiny scales are fleeing from alarming whales), while on the right-hand page, a whale really does pursue the gilled pals: A lake's too small for the whale to roam, that's why he calls the sea his home. Other favorites such as a crab, seahorse and octopus (nine sea creatures in all) inhabit the saltwater setting. This makes a terrific gift, or a great addition to your backseat library.
